Word Origin and History

“small glass bottle for vinegar, oil, etc.,” c.1300, Anglo-French diminutive of Old French *crue* “an earthen pot,” from Frankish **kruka* or some other Germanic source (cf. Old High German *kruog*); related to *crock*.

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
